

New Testament B 2011-2012

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Course Description:

This course is a broad survey of the New Testament. In this class the student will explore the structure of each individual NT book, its relation to the entire NT and examine the major themes found in each book. Students will become familiar with the tools used to aid one's Bible study, learn major Biblical characters, and become acquainted with the historical setting of the NT. They will also understand the relation of the Old Testament to the New. Overall, students will see God revealing Himself through His Word and learn how to apply the Scriptures to their own lives.

Course Requirements:

- Students will read each book of the New Testament in its entirety according to the class schedule. Reading assignments must be read before class to enable the student to participate in class discussions.
- Students will be assigned a variety of activities to explore the New Testament. These activities will include making observations, outlining chapters and books, memorizing verses, preparing maps, charting books, writing biographies, answering questions, making tables and charts, completing word studies and exercises in using reference materials. Additionally, each student will be required to lead a discussion on one New Testament book.
- 3. Students will discuss the text and assignments in class.

Read Matthew 1-4. Research 3 of the names mentioned in the genealogy of chapter 1. Write two paragraphs or more of a biography on each of 3 individuals citing where in the Old Testament this information can be found. Assignment must be typed.
